we are all different and unique; a reminder to our children that this should be celebrated and to remember that they should be themselves, accepting of one another and celebrate difference.

St Francis Priorities

Each year schools set priorities that they work towards to drive the school forward to continue the excellence that they achieve. When priorities are set they are not a reflection of poor attainment or of particular weakness, it is merely a focus in school to continue to drive the school in its journey to continued excellence. Listed below are 3 of our 6 areas that we are working on this academic year:

Religious Education ~ we have been looking at how we mark and provide feedback to our children within lessons to maximise how they further deepen their higher order thinking and build depth into their knowledge and understanding. What can I do at home?

Discuss their RE learning and concepts, read scripture from the Bible together and attend church to further deepen their knowledge of the faith.



Mental health & well-being ~ we have been developing our understanding of regulation of emotions through using the colour monster story. As a school we invest time into meditation through prayer journaling & mindfulness in PE. We have also have our nurture provision, with Mrs Harrison being our learning mentor and developed several nurture interventions to support our children with their emotions, anxiety and friendships. What can I do at home?

Talk to your child about their feelings and emotions, read / watch the colour monster story. You could even have a look at their online footprint and discuss how this impacts on their mental health & well-being.

High challenge in Reading, Writing & Maths for all learners, so that we can provide children with the knowledge and skills to succeed in life ~ within Reading as you will be aware, we have adjusted our reading routine so that across school, our day starts and ends with reading. This is because reading is the key to suc-

cess! If our children can read and infer they have opened a door to the future! We need to read in order to access life in simple tasks from reading ingredients in a supermarket to reading signs / information when travelling.

We follow the ELS scheme for the teaching of reading with our younger children and this quickly develops to children progressing onto the 'big cat' reading scheme. Class reading of novels has a key focus on fluency & vocabulary acquisition, which then builds understanding of the text. Writing & Maths to follow in the coming weeks...

What can I do at home?

Read as much as possible with your child and record this in their reading record.


